## News and Updates

### A note from this month's editor

One of the key tools relied upon in emergency response is Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR). Cardiovascular disease is the No. 1 killer of adults in the United States, and 680 Americans die each day from sudden cardiac arrest.

At an early age, we are taught that being trained in CPR can help us to save lives. Depending on which statistics you read, CPR is cited (*when performed correctly and promptly*) to almost double the chances of survival. As the American Heart Association simply puts it, "If more people knew CPR, more lives could be saved." (FOOTNOTE)

As professionals in the EHS arena, we ensure that our Emergency Response Teams are trained in CPR and we may even sponsor employee CPR training events. Even with the advent of Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs), CPR is used as the first line of defense until an AED or paramedic team arrives.

But what if, in spite of all the training provided, the majority of people still did not perform CPR correctly- resulting in studies publishing a 1 in 20 chance of surviving cardiac arrest, even after receiving CPR. What if even the experts were caught doing it wrong?

The May volume of Harvard Health Letter poses those exact questions. In the article "CPR: are we doing it wrong?" studies are cited where the experts were caught giving compressions too shallowly and slowly, as well as hyperventilating their patients the majority of the time.

What is the solution? So far, it's undecided. Computer-guided CPR that gives audio prompts has been suggested, but the cost may be a deterrent in widespread use. A study in Seattle suggests compression-only CPR as the solution. The study stated this after having fire department dispatchers perform, at random, either compression-only CPR or standard CPR and finding identical survival rates after hundreds of trials. But, the counter opinion is that the success in that situation depended on the quick response time of paramedic teams, which forces us to ask what would happen after four to five minutes of no ventilation?

We may have an answer soon as the American Heart Association will publish new guidelines in November as a follow-up to the meeting last January of international CPR experts, which is held every five years. Until then, it is up to the trainer to keep current on the latest guidelines and research findings and issue a disclaimer with each training event. CPR may save lives, and does improve the chances of survival from cardiac arrest when performed correctly, but there are no guarantees. As first responders and good Samaritans, we can only do our best to help the victim. The outcome of an emergency is not determined by our actions alone, but by the combination of many factors- not all of which we can control.

## Apple recalling iBook and PowerBook computer batteries

Apple Computer Inc., of Cupertino, CA is recalling about 128,000 rechargeable batteries for iBook G4 and PowerBook G4 computers, sold from October 2004 through May 2005. An internal short can cause the battery cells to overheat, posing a **fire hazard**. Apple has received six reports worldwide of batteries overheating, including two reports in the United States. The recalled lithium ion batteries are used with the following computers:

If you have one of these batteries, you should stop using it immediately and contact Apple to arrange for a replacement battery, free of charge. ## Safety Notice Regarding Scott AV-3000 Full Facepiece Respirators

Scott has received reports of cracks being found in the plastic lens frames that encircle the AV-3000 facepiece that were manufactured between August 2003 and September 2004.

The lens frame is the black plastic ring that goes around the outside perimeter of the lens, over the face seal. The frame is made of two pieces, a top and a bottom which are connected together at the sides of the facepiece. AV-3000 facepieces are used with a variety of Scott breathing equipment, including the following:

- 2.2 2216 PSA SCBA
- 3.0 3000 PSA SCBA

## OSHA Issues Fine for Bacteria Exposure

OSHA has completed its investigation of researcher exposure to tularemia bacteria at Boston University and Boston Medical Center, Evans Biomedical Research Center, which resulted in three employees becoming ill.

OSHA learned of the exposures, which took place late last summer and early fall, through media reports. OSHA has issued to Boston University and Boston Medical Center Corporation identical sets of citations alleging three serious violations each of OSHA's personal protective equipment standard, including: failure to ensure that all employees wore gloves and eye protection when working with tularemia live vaccine strain (LVS); failure to certify in writing the required workplace hazard assessment for work with tularemia LVS; and failure to retrain employees who were working with tularemia LVS and who were not using gloves and eye protection.

The total proposed penalty for the alleged violations is \$8,100.

## Hazmat Registration 2005-2006: does your company have to register?

It's time to register for a Hazardous Materials Certificate of Registration. The new registration year starts on July 1st.

### Who needs to register?

The main criteria determining registration status is whether a company offers or transports placarded amounts of hazmat. Every year, there are companies that use placards during hazmat transportation, but have not registered. Plus, some companies use only Class 9 placards and register unnecessarily; since Class 9 placards are not required domestically, in many cases registration is also not required. And, some companies that ship or transport consumer commodities placard and register each year, even when they may not have to.

## Upcoming Compliance Deadlines

### Industrial Storm Water Program: annual report due July 1<sup>st</sup>

The Industrial Storm Water General Permit Order 97-03-DWQ ([General Industrial Permit](#)) is an NPDES permit that regulates discharges associated with 10 broad categories of industrial activities. The Permit requires the implementation of management measures that will achieve the performance standard of best available technology economically achievable and best conventional pollutant control technology. In addition, the development of a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) and a monitoring plan is required. Through the SWPPP, sources of pollutants are to be identified and the means to manage the sources to reduce storm water pollution are described. The General Industrial Permit requires that an annual report be submitted each July 1. Facility operators may be able to participate in [group monitoring program](#).

### TRI General Information: report due July 1st

Reporting to the Toxic Chemical Release Inventory (i.e., Toxics Release Inventory, TRI) is required by section 313 of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA, or Title III of the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986), Public Law 99-499.

The Pollution Prevention Act, passed into law in October, 1990 (Pub. L. 101-508), added reporting requirements to Form R. These requirements affect all facilities required to submit Form R under section 313 of EPCRA.

Reporting is required to provide the public with information on the releases and other waste management of EPCRA section 313 chemicals in their communities and to provide EPA with release and other waste management information to assist the Agency in determining the need for future regulations. Facilities must report the quantities of routine and accidental releases, and releases resulting from catastrophic or other one time events of EPCRA section 313 chemicals, as well as the maximum amount of the EPCRA section 313 chemical on-site during the calendar year and the amount contained in wastes managed on-site or transferred off-site.

A completed Form R or Form A must be submitted for each EPCRA section 313 chemical manufactured, processed, or otherwise used at each covered facility as described in the reporting rules in 40 CFR Part 372.

### *Who Must Report?*

Section 313 of EPCRA requires that reports be filed by owners and operators of facilities that meet all of the following criteria. " The facility has 10 or more full-time employee equivalents; and " The facility is included in Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Codes 10 (except 1011, 1081, and 1094), 12 (except 1241), 20–39, 4911 (limited to facilities that combust coal and/or oil for the purpose of generating electricity for distribution in commerce), 4931 (limited to facilities that combust coal and/or oil for the purpose of generating electricity for distribution in commerce), 4939 (limited to facilities that combust coal and/or oil for the purpose of generating electricity for distribution in commerce), 4953 (limited to facilities regulated under RCRA Subtitle C, 42 U.S.C. section 6921 *et seq.*), 5169, 5171, and 7389 (limited to facilities primarily engaged in solvents recovery services on a contract or fee basis); and 'The facility manufactures (defined to include importing), processes, or otherwise uses any EPCRA section 313 chemical in quantities greater than the established threshold in the course of a calendar year.
